**Draft Resolution 1,1**

**Adopted by the World Health Organization on its 1st meeting on 2nd May 2020**

The World Health Assembly,

*Guided* by the purposes and principles of the UN charter

*Affirming* the fact that prophylactic abseeism is one of the examples of voluntary- risk modifying behaviour in response to pandemics,

*Recalling* the CARES act which was instrumental in alleviating the national economic crisis

*Reaffirming* CES (Constant Elasticity of substitution) as combinations of the domestic and the imported variety of each commodity similar to the commodity inputs for industries,

*Observing* that for economic modelling (IDM) INFECTIOUS DISEASE MODEL should be designed to provide a probabilistic view of the number of deaths,

*Taking into account* that following the Chinese Wuhan Virus it has adversely affected the Inclusive and sustainable economic growth and it is preventing the sustainable industrialization and foster innovation,

1. *Approves* of Frances' blood plasma transfusion testings of recovered patients with antibodies which has previously worked in small studies on ebola and SARS which is to be transported to countries highly affected by Chinese Wuhan Virus until a vaccine is discovered;

2. *Affirms* Frances' chomage partiel(partial employment) scheme on giving financial aid to low income families in order to increase their effective demand to bring the economy back in its cycle;
3. *Urges* nations to subsidise small businesses and infant industries in order to cover wage expenses in order to encourage business survival despite the initial low number of sales;
4. *Emphasizes* the need for humanitarian trade and proposes meetings among leading nations with the aim to lay out health and food trade rules and alleviation of poverty;
5. *Expressing appreciation* over Russian Federation delivery of medical assistance and military medical equipment to hard-hit countries such as Italy, United States of America and Serbia;
6. *Strongly encourages* the creation of a green recovery fund, supported by the European Union and led by Germany to align economic models with planetary boundaries;
7. *Calls for* supply chain diversification and condemns haphazard protectionism;

*Condone*s new budgetary measures,additional funds for hospital and supplies with turning electronic factories to make ventilators and offers wage subsidies for affected business and and the unemployed with reduced taxes and interest rate and violation fines for those who leave isolation;

8. *Proposes* the following solutions under the future Unites States' national plan of action:
  - a, Assistance for American Workers and Families through:
    - i, Liquidity Injection of the precedent set by Donald Trump which would be provide 1,000 dollars in aid to each individual, above 17 provided that they meet IRS restrictions, and provide a copy of the following forms:
      - i,a) SSA-1099;
      - iib) RRB-1099;
    - ii, The IRS website online will also serve this purpose through online means;
  - b, Aiding miniscule businesses:
    - i; The Paycheck Protection Program of the United States is providing minuscule businesses with the assets they require to perpetuate their payroll, hire back employees who may have been laid off, and cover applicable overhead;
    - ii; The Paycheck Protection Program inaugurated by the CARES Act, is to be enacted by the Small Business Administration with support from the

Department of the Treasury which provides diminutive businesses with funds to pay up to 8 weeks of payroll costs including benefits

iii; The Paycheck Protection Program will prioritize millions of Americans employed by diminutive businesses by sanctioning up to \$349 billion toward job retention and certain other expenses Minute businesses and eligible nonprofit organizations;

c; Safeguarding Jobs for American Industry which will be done through:

i. Employee Retention Credit;

ii, Supplemental Tax Credits;

iii, Payroll Tax Deferral;

iv; Payroll support;

v; Loan Support;

d, Aiding local Businesses:

i, Establishing under the CARES Act, payments to State, Local, and Tribal regimes are provided to avail the amelioration for the impact of the CHINESE WUHAN VIRUS outbreak and The budget will be of \$150 billion dollars and Treasury will make payments from the Fund to States and eligible units of local regime; the District of Columbia and U.S, Territories and Tribal regimes;

ii, \$775 million in peregrine assistance to date which will ameliorate public health inculcation, for fend healthcare facilities, and increment laboratory, disease-surveillance, and expeditious-replication capacity in more than 100 of the world's most in peril countries— all in an effort to avail contain outbreaks afore they reach our shores;

iii, The State Department, USAID, and CDC will look forward to collaborating to fortify health systems, humanitarian assistance, and economic, security, and stabilization efforts ecumenical with the \$2,4 billion in an emergency supplemental funding Congress has allocated because of which The United States will be by far the most munificent and reliable contributor to crisis replication and

humanitarian action through UNICEF, the World Food Program, and dozens of international organizations;

9. Accepts the framework Price, Cash flow and Credit through which:

- a, \$5,6 million will be paid to employees under the Jobs Support Scheme;
- b, \$500 million will be paid out by end-June 2021;
- c, The Singaporean government has imposed a suspension of income tax payments for companies and self-employed:
  - i, Income tax due in April, May and June can now be paid by July 2020 by companies and businesses;
  - ii, Self-employed can now pay income tax in August 2020 instead of July 2020;
- d, The Government will enhance the Property Tax Rebate;
- e, Commercial properties such as hotels, tourist attractions will not be required to pay Property Tax for the year of 2020;
- f, A property Tax Rebate of 30 percent for 2020 has been issued by the Government of Singapore for small scale businesses;
- g, Rental Waivers will be granted to stallholders by the National Environment Agency of Singapore for three months;
- h, Other government agencies will give rental waivers to eligible renters for half a month extra;
- i, The government will freeze all government payments and charges if the situation does not get better;
- j, The government, with the help of Temporary Bridging Loan Programme will help enterprises especially relating to the tourism sector;
- k, Changing the loan limit from \$5 million to \$10 million to support businesses economic needs;
- l; Loan insurance payments will be increased from 50 percent to 80 percent;
- m; The Government of Singapore is working with several Financial Institutions to prolong capital payment for one year on loans if requested by businesses;
- n; \$20 billion will be set aside for loan capital in the next budget;

o;The Monetary Authority of Singapore is working along with banks to ensure businesses do not face challenges with cash flow;

2, Endorses the policy introduced by Singapore to assist its aviation and tourism related sectors, including measures such as:

a. Giving a seventy-five percent wage offset to every local employee in the aviation sector costing the government more than \$400 million;

b; Introducing a \$350 million aviation support package to fund procedures such as rebates on parking charges and rent relief for airlines;

c; Providing benefits of the Job Support Scheme to Singapore Airlines to reduce operating costs;

10; Authorizes the measures to be implemented by Singapore Government which include:

a. Waiving ‘Monthly Foreign Worker Levy’ to ease pressure on cash flows through which:

I; Workers will receive the rebate by the end of May 2020;

II; Resources will be redirected back to firms in order for them to manage all needs of their employees;

b. Every local employee with receive co-funding of wages from 8 percent to 25 percent;

c. Employees in the food services sectors will receive 50 percent of their wages;

d. Taxi drivers will be partnered with the Land Transport Authority to deliver help;

*Requests* creditors to suspend debt payments from middle income and creditworthy poorer countries;

*Proposes* the following Global Coronavirus Relief Framework under the future Russian Federation's plan of action which will provide medical and economic assistance to hard-hit countries and small economies suffering from the coronavirus pandemic based on three pillars:

- a. Protecting health services and systems ;
- b. Protecting jobs and small and medium sized enterprises;
- c. Macroeconomic response;

*Approves* the following system for the creation of a sustainable economy in Germany;

*Decides* to remain actively seized on the matter.
