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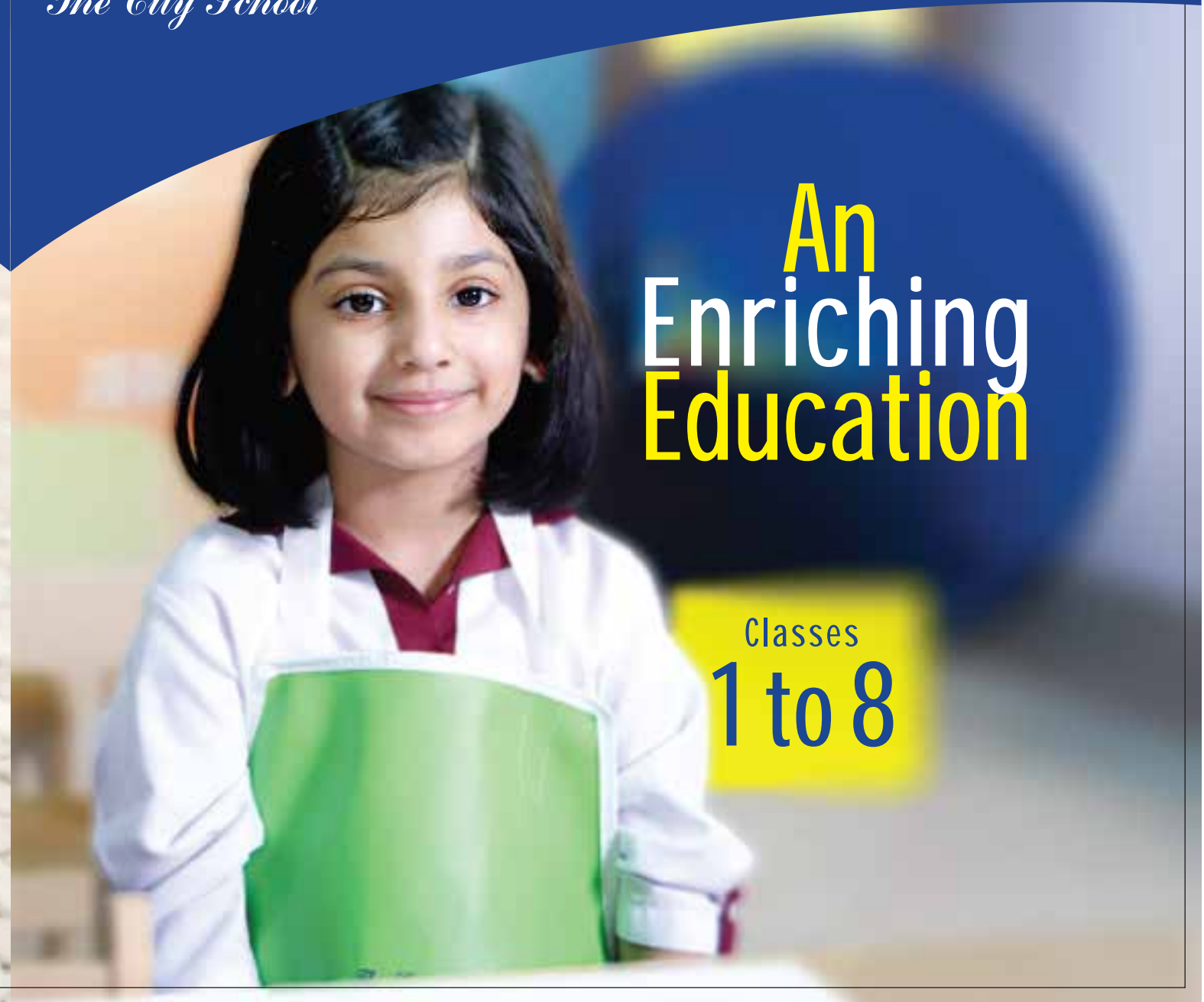

5. SKILLS-BASED CURRICULUM

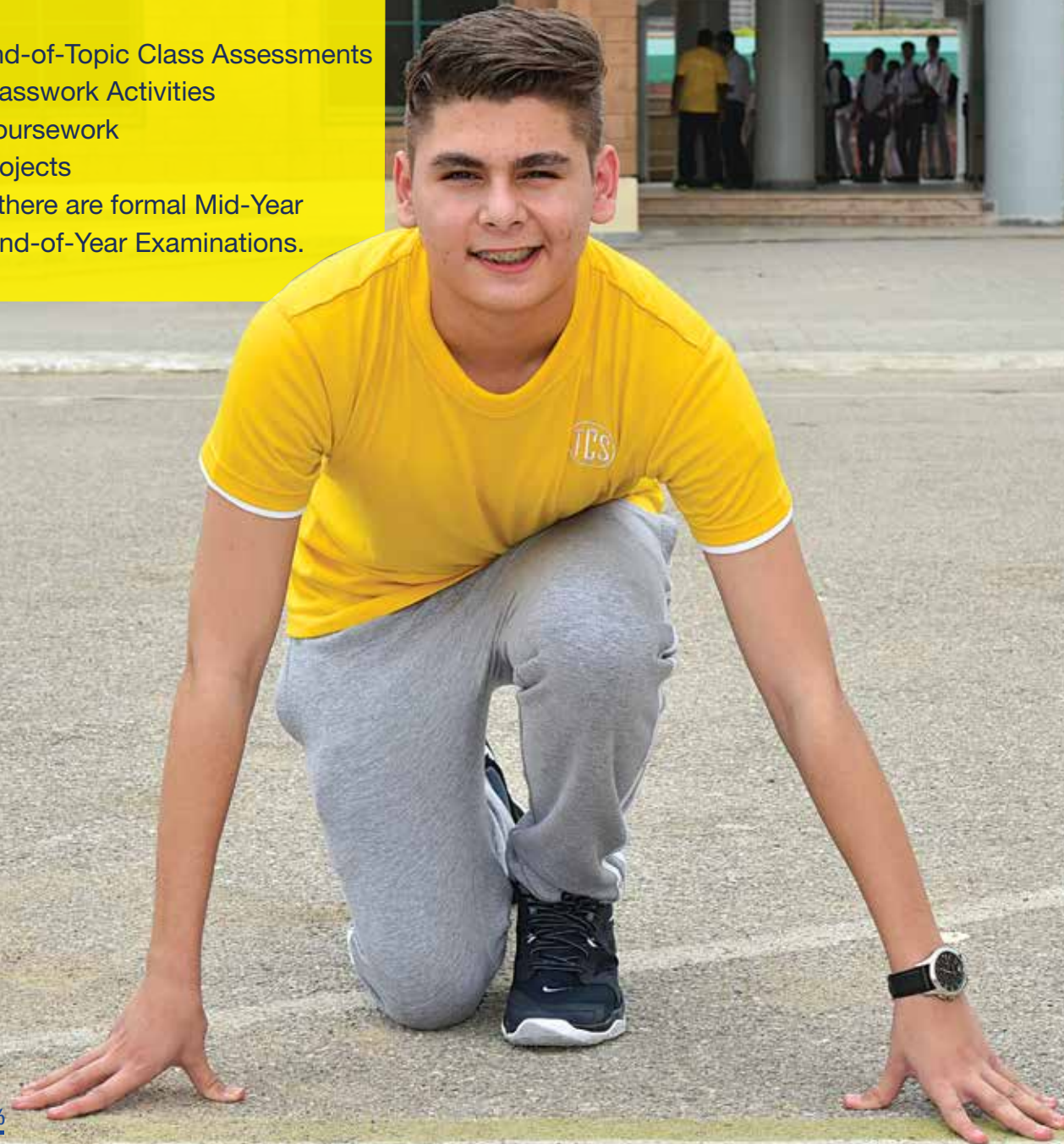

- National trips to develop collaborative learning, leadership skills, cultural experiences, problem-solving, team-building



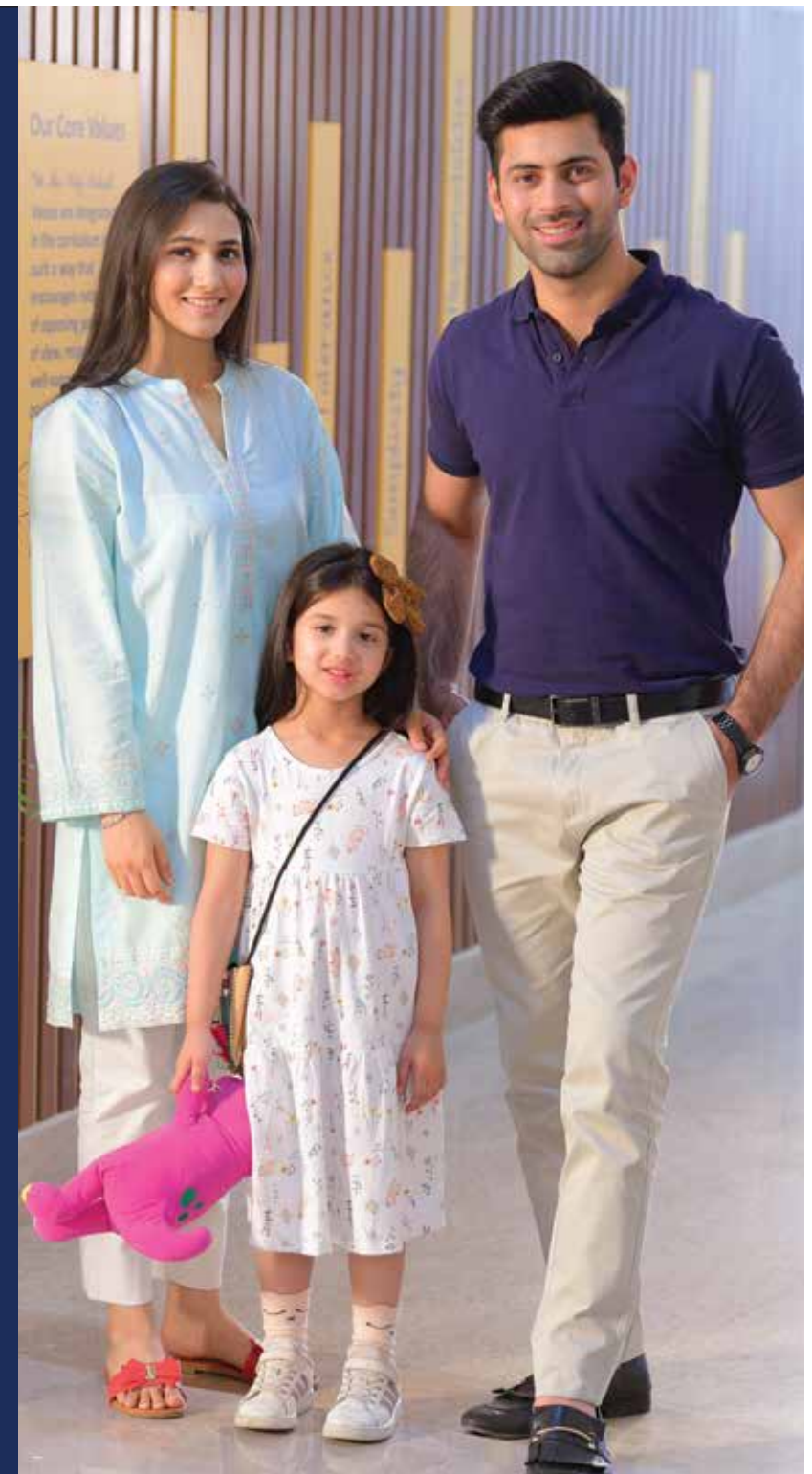


10. SPORTS AND CO-CURRICULAR PROGRAMMES
